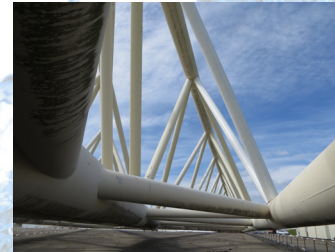
ADDITIONAL DETAILS

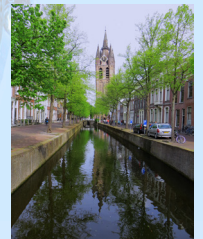
